REGARDING DEAD MAN'S CURVE

Regarding Dead Man's curve,

WHILE WE KNOW SPEEDING WAS A FACTOR AND USUALLY IS A FACTOR. IF CHANGES CAN SAVE JUST ONE LIFE. ITS A GOOD THING.

Following Email was sent out today to DOT, NYPD, Councilwoman Paladino's office as well as several others.

Attaching a video leading up to and on Dead Man's curve. If you notice on the video, it is not well lit. At night the approach and curve are extremely dark under ideal weather conditions let alone inclement weather.

The extremely poor, actually non existent signage before the curve other than a height limitation sign. The first "arrow" sign is at the very beginning (already too late point) of the turn.

Also note on the right lane, right before exit 36 N, there is water and ice that builds up and creates a dangerous ice condition (this is a seriously dangerous condition at several spots on the CIP)

Dorian Colucci Mecir made a suggestion of adding spaced out rumble strips before the curve along with actual signage. I think this is an excellent start. She also suggested an on site meeting (in a safe location of course) to get a better understanding and work on making this location as safe as possible.

DAVID BAYER

David Bayer's Vietnam Service:

A native of Whitestone, David Bayer enlisted into the United States Air Force in 1966 at the young age of eighteen. He served his country with honor during the Vietnam War as a Crew Chief on a KC-135 Stratotanker, in which he engaged in dangerous, and selfless in-flight refueling missions over the Mekong Delta and the Gulf of Tonkin, risking his life to ensure that other Americans were able to return to their bases safely. David served overseas in Vietnam during the peak of the war (1968-69), wherein he earned numerous medals including the Vietnam Service Medal, the National Defense Medal, and more. David was honorably discharged from the United States Air Force in 1970. He is now a proud member of Whitestone's Edward McKee American Legion Post 131; Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 32.




